NAPLAN results

This year, the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) has introduced new standards for NAPLAN reporting. Four proficiency standards have replaced the previous 10 numerical bands and national minimum standards used in previous years' reporting:

Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.

Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.

<u>Developing</u>: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.

Needs additional support: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing.

I want to take this opportunity to congratulate our Grade 3 and 5 students on the way they have tried their personal best to achieve their highest possible results.

I would like to thank all the teachers who have supported these students through their educational journey.

More than half of the students are exceeding or strong results on the proficiency scale. We look forward to unpacking this data further to ensure we can continue to target the individual needs of our students learning.







2023 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey: Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / quardians think of our school. The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese


























Road Safety

I cannot stress the importance of being a cautious driver when driving around school zones. Children can be very unpredictable and sometimes their instincts to walk across the road or chase a ball are difficult to control. I urge families to slow down when coming and going from the school so that accidents do not occur.

I also want families to take great care when turning from Meadows Drive on Taylors Road. This intersection is a very busy one between 3:30pm and 4:00pm. Please slow down, be patient and wait for the safest opportunity to turn as we want to avoid any accidents in this location. After the motor vehicle accident last week I have raised my concerns with Melton Council as well as the Minister of Education to highlight the needs of faster action with road and footpath infrastructure in the school area. If I receive any correspondence, I will share it in a future newsletter.

Parking



Parents are reminded that the streets around the school are narrow. We are sharing the road with many construction trucks and trade vehicles. Therefore, we need to remember to navigate the streets at signed speeds as well as park in signed areas appropriately. It has been bought to my attention that some parents have parked their vehicles illegally at the back entrance. Often cars are left with the rear of the vehicle still partially on the road.

This creates a road hazard as vehicles need to drive around the car on the narrow road. We simply ask that you take the time to park your vehicle accurately before leaving it and helping our community to remain safe. In addition to this, please do not park in neighbours' driveways or in the staff car park.

Melton Council have been asked to support the school by adding lined parking bays as well as regular visits to monitor safe and legal parking.

Melton Council have also added signs to the kindergarten at the back of the rear of the school. Please show respect to this facility by not parking in their designated car park as it only for the staff and visitors of that centre.








Book Week 2023








The 5/6 students have begun experimenting like scientists.

We have been investigating different light sources and how light travels in a straight line. This week we were observing how mirrors reflect light in different directions and how to light up an object around the corner. It has been exciting making new discoveries and wonderings about light in Deanside Primary School!

In STEM this fortnight, the students have been super busy in both the STEM room and the school garden.

Prep – 2 students have focussed on the journey of food from farm to their plates. They have also participated in play-based learning where students are creating their own farms using legos and farm animals. Students are also sorting fruit and vegetables into ones they know, don't know, like to eat or don't like to eat. This has provoked discussion amongst the students about healthy eating and what they enjoy to eat.



The 3-4 students have been busy in gardening planting vegetables and herbs. The students are hoping they will be able to harvest towards the end of term. They have been doing research into how to look after their seedlings and creating posters to ensure they are looked after.

The grade 5-6 students have been designing their Rosemary products using a design process. They have been carefully reading through the recipes to understand the ingredients required and the method. There is also a focus on the health and safety aspects of being in the kitchen. The students have been collaborating in groups to discuss and agree on designing aspects.
