Sports Field

I am still in ongoing communication with the Victorian Schools Building Authority (VSBA) regarding the Sports Field. They have recognised that there is an issue with drainage and watering system. It is hoped that I will receive a plan on how/when they will be beginning the works to correct this issue in the near future. It is anticipated that when works begin, it will be unable to be used until end of Term 1 2024. In the meantime, all irrigation to the field has now been switched off, allowing for the surface to dry. It is hoped that it will be freshly mowed in the next week and children can return to playing on it once cut. However, they will only be able to use it until the VSBA action works on the area.

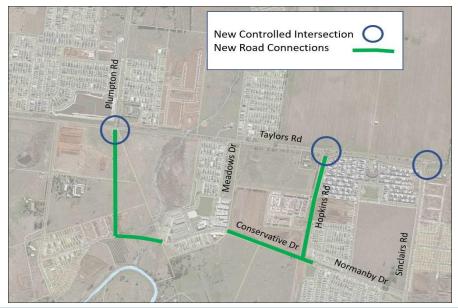


New Roads

This week I met with members from Melton Council to discuss roads and pedestrian infrastructure. From that discussion I can confirm that the extension of Conservatory Drive is advancing through construction with developers working towards an end of November 2023 opening. This new road provides an alternative connection to Sinclairs Road via Normanby Boulevard. The new road will allow parents, when leaving the school, to utilise the new connection via Sinclairs Road and avoid turning right at Meadows Drive and utilising the roundabout at Sinclairs and Taylors Road. This connection is the first step in improving the road network for residents of Deanside and leads several new road projects that will over the next three years that will support both active and vehicle travel for our community. 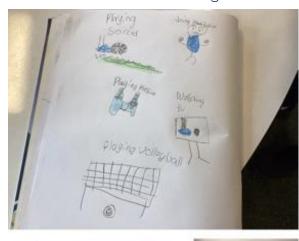

next fortnight.



























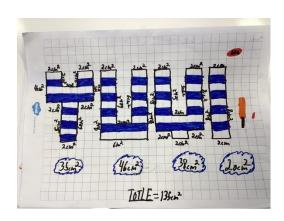


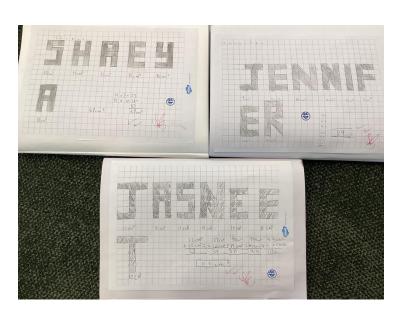


Year 3/4

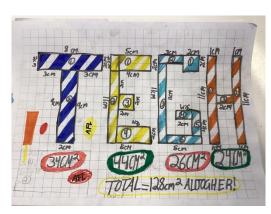
This fortnight in Year 3/4, students explored the concept of Area and calculated the area of rectangular and square objects in the and out of the classroom. Students demonstrated their knowledge of the area of compound shapes by calculating the area of their names using grid paper. Students finalised their Poetry unit and worked hard to publish their pieces and create their own book of poetry. 3/4s also celebrated Science Week by sharing their knowledge of 'Heat' with other students in our school through making educational posters within groups. 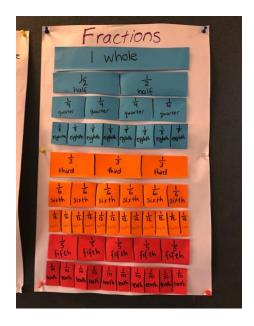


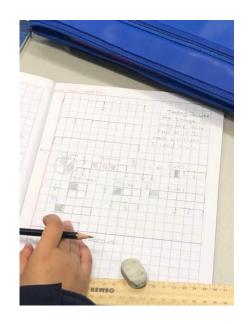


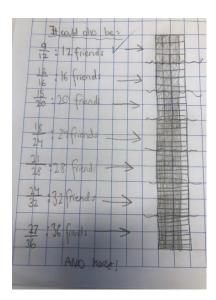


Year 5/6

For the last 3 weeks the 5/6 students have been working really hard on a Fractions unit. We have been creating fraction walls, where students made a variety of fractions from wholes to tenths, by folding strips of paper. From here we looked at fractions of a collection, for example finding out that a fifth of 25 is 5. Students then plotted fractions on number lines, between 0-1. We added and subtracted fractions with common denominators and explored equivalent fractions. Students also applied their learning to a range of worded and open-ended problems, which have expanded on their thinking. It has been great to see of cohort work so hard on our unit, so ask your child to discuss what they have learnt with you.



























It has been a busy and productive fortnight for students in STEM. Students in Prep-2 created rainbow place mats to show their understanding of healthy eating. Students in grade 3-4 were in the kitchen observing the cooking of vegetable soup with vegetables donated by Aintree community garden - Eat, Grow and Garden. News from Physical Education

This fortnight, students in Grade Prep, One and Two have continued to explore their Invasion Sports unit. The Grade Prep students have spent time using skills such as bouncing, kicking, passing and catching in mini team challenges. The Grade One and Two students have been exploring the different ways to pass a ball such as a chest pass, bounce pass and overhead pass in different team games.



The Grade 3-6 students have also continued to explore their Invasion Games Unit. The Grade 3 and 4 students have focused on refining different skills such as bouncing and passing a basketball, controlling a soccer ball, and trapping and passing in Hockey. Students implemented these skills in different team challenges and gameplay scenarios. The Grade 5 and 6 students have focused on sequencing skills together to use during gameplay in sports such as Basketball, Soccer, Netball and Hockey.
