called Mr Mubeen. Keep up the great work Mubeen!





are less likely to be swooped. The babies will probably leave the nest in the next few weeks, so we will be experiencing ongoing magpie visits for at least another month.


Some simple tips for dealing with swooping magpies include

Hats

We are now heading into high UV days with Summer guickly approaching. Students all must be wearing a broadbrim hat for any outside activities. If a student does not have a hat on they will possibly miss outside activities and recess breaks. Please support the school SunSmart policy by ensuring your child has a broadbrim hat to wear. To support families with getting access to a school hat, they can now be bought through the school reception for \$20.

Thunderstorm asthma — be prepared this pollen season

Grass pollen season, which runs from October to December each year, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm asthma. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening. Deanside Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe when the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid, and we will monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater level of risk.

How you can prepare?

During pollen season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma: talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect your child from the risk of thunderstorm asthma, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever: see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing: it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'. Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.
- If your child has an asthma plan, please make sure the school is provided a copy so that we can follow the appropriate individual steps.

























Parking

Over the holidays Melton City Council supported the school by adding in clear line parking and parking bays around the school. Parents are asked to ensure they read and be familiar with the signage around the school. There are some red zones, that are designated for 'Drop off and Pick Up Zone, allowing families to drive into the space, allow the children to get out of the car or enter the car on the curb side. It is a very simple and effective way of getting children in to and out of the car if our community support this process.

Homework Grid Family Survey

Thank you to all the families who responded to our survey regarding Homework. We appreciate the honest feedback provided by our families. The results have been very helpful in understanding the wants of our community regarding homework.

Homework is really a tool to support the learning that is taking place in the classroom. It is meant to be a way for students to <u>practice</u> what they have already learnt to do, which in turn allows them to build independence. This focus of homework is to build fluency in their learning. It should not be challenging or difficult to do on their own.

Some of the feedback included:

- 73% of our families believe that our Home Grids are a useful tool to support learning.
- 81% of students are reading between four nights and seven nights a week.
- 60% of families are maintaining a record of reading at home.
- An overall number of comments were positive towards maintaining the grids as a way for students to complete their homework over the 2-week period.

Our School Improvement Team will now take this feedback and make some changes coming into 2024.

Curriculum Day

We have 2 curriculum days this term to support our teachers professional learning. The dates are:

- Monday 6th November
- Monday 18th December

Our focus for Monday the 6th of November will be on beginning to develop our understanding of Mathematics in the classroom, and building clarity on how we engage students through high quality Numeracy Lessons, which support all students. We are so lucky to engage the services of a consultant from the Mathematical Association of Victoria (MAV) to support our learning.

News from 1/2 Grades


As we start Term 4, the students have been busy getting back into routine and enjoying all the fun activities. During our rainy days, we were watching movies and catching up on our fun holidays!







News from 3/4 Grades

News from 5/6 Grades


In Spelling this week, Year 5/6 students have been focusing on the digraph, 'gn' which makes an 'n' sound, as in gnome.


Students have selected their own spelling words containing this digraph and have both defined these words as well as broken them into their sounds.






















News from STEM






























News from Physical Education
