

Before and After School Supervision

Student safety at Deanside Primary School is our highest priority and the safe and appropriate supervision of students is an important element of our duty of care. Part of this duty is ensuring parents and students are aware of our student supervision arrangements before and after school.

- Before school: School grounds are supervised between 8:45-9:00am with 3 staff members on yard duty. The school gates open each morning by 8:45am.
- After school: School grounds are supervised from 3:30-3:45pm with 3 staff members on yard duty. The school gates open each afternoon by 3:25pm.

Familes are requested to ensure that students do not attend school outside of these supervised times unless they are attending before or after school care. 
News from Prep




News from Grade 3/4




















News from Grade 5/6


