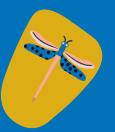

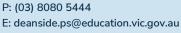

#### Road Safety

With the holidays so close, I would like to remind everyone about the importance of staying safe and being seen on and around our roads. As a driver, a passenger, or as a pedestrian, we all must negotiate the road traffic environment on a daily basis.

Children are especially vulnerable around vehicles and roads due to their size and unpredictability.

Take the opportunity to talk to your children about being a safe road-users.

- When walking with your children make sure you are using the school or pedestrian crossings rather than taking potentially unsafe shortcuts.
- When walking through shopping centre car parks be very aware of the slow moving and reversing cars in the area. Stay on the footpaths provided rather than walking through the parking areas.
- Talk about the importance of wearing seat belts and insist that everyone in the vehicle wears appropriate restraints for their age and size.
- Always demonstrate responsible and safe behaviours when driving, as a passenger or while walking anywhere around vehicles and roads.
- When on bikes, scooters or skateboards please wear a helmet.

Easter time gets very busy on our roads and we must ensure that we are always taking care when in and around traffic and vehicles. Stay safe.

#### Berry Street at Deanside

Last Friday, teachers embraced the learning opportunity to engage in professional development with a trainer from Berry Street. The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) is being embedded into our practices across the school to support students and create impactful learning environments. It acknowledges the interconnectedness of emotional well-being, social skills, and academic success. BSEM equips educators with strategies to address the diverse needs of students, fostering resilience and creating inclusive classrooms. A cornerstone of BSEM professional development is the integration of practices such as circle time and brain breaks into daily routines. These simple yet powerful strategies hold the potential to significantly enhance the learning experience for both students and teachers.

#### Circle Time:

Circle time is more than just a gathering; it's a ritual of connection and community building. It provides a structured opportunity for students to share experiences, express emotions, and develop empathy. By fostering a sense of belonging and trust, circle time sets the stage for meaningful learning interactions. Teachers facilitate discussions on topics ranging from emotions and values to academic goals, creating a safe space for open dialogue and reflection. Through circle time, students learn to respect diverse perspectives, cultivate interpersonal skills, and develop emotional resilience. Students participate in circle time each morning and afternoon.

#### Brain Breaks:

Brain breaks offer a welcome respite, rejuvenating both body and mind. These brief physical activity or mindfulness exercises help students recharge and refocus, enhancing their cognitive abilities and overall well-being. Whether it's a quick stretch, a deep-breathing exercise, or a fun dance routine, brain breaks inject energy into the classroom, promoting engagement and productivity. By incorporating regular brain breaks into lessons, teachers create a conducive learning environment where students can thrive academically and emotionally.

Ask your children about these practises and how they help them engage with their classroom community and their learning.

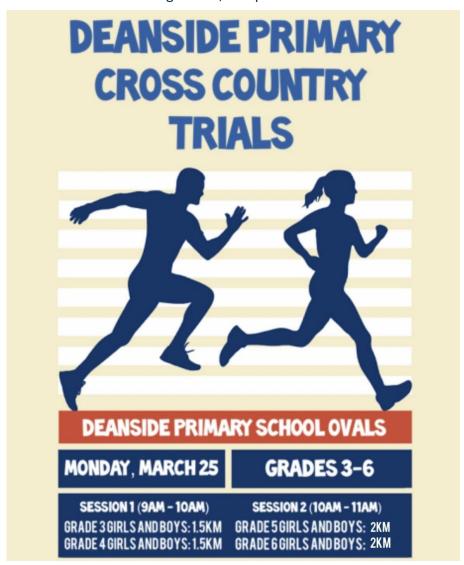
## **Grade 3-6 Cross Country Trials.**

Students have also poured their hearts into writing their narratives, showing off their imaginative sides and sharing these stories with excitement.

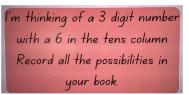

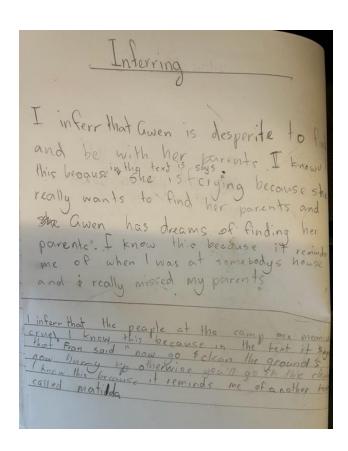


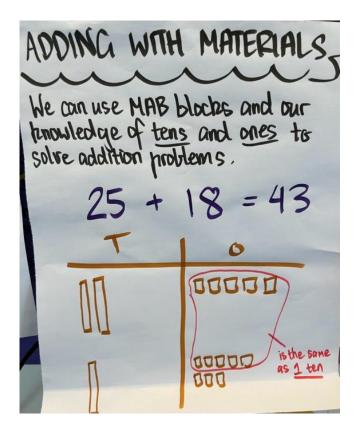


## News from Grade 3/4 Classes

In reading, students have been learning about how good readers infer and make connections while they read. They have also continued to explore the narrative genre in writing, working through the early stages of planning and generating interesting ideas that suit their purpose and audience. In maths, Year 3/4s have begun their additive thinking unit. They are learning about mental strategies such as jump strategy, split strategy, and friends of 10 to solve larger addition problems efficiently. In inquiry, students have continued to collaborate and explore how to make healthy and safe decisions outside in the yard. This also promotes healthy relationships and interactions between them that align with our Deanside PS values.

#### Writing

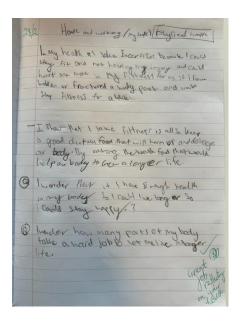

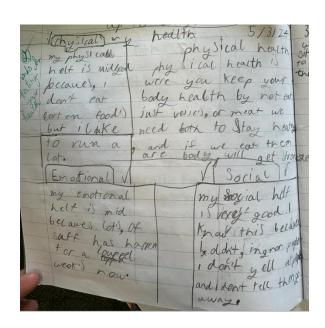
We have worked hard in trying to get our pieces published.

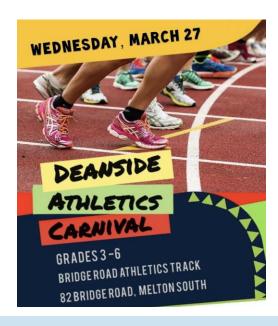
## News from Physical Education

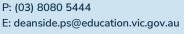

## News from Visual Arts

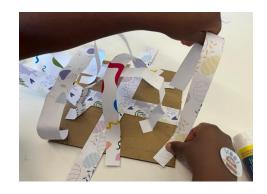
