PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Deanside Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Deanside Primary's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Deanside Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

Deanside Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are as follows:

- Navy Short Sleeve Polo with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy Long Sleeve Polo with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy Bonded Jacket with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy V-Neck Windcheater with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy Hooded Windcheater with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy Puffa Jacket with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Navy Double Knee Track
- Blue/White/Black Check Deanside Primary School Dress
- Navy Shorts
- Navy Skorts
- Navy Bucket Hat with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Beanie with Deanside Primary School's logo
- Grade 6 custom uniform items (designed by students)

General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Deanside Primary School students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name. Deanside Primary School strongly encourages the use of RagTag'd to track student belongings.
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these are navy or white.

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear jewellery that may pose a risk to themselves or others at school. For example, chains, necklaces and bracelets purchased through retail outlets. However, stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics and false nails may not be worn at school. Nails to be kept neat and manageable.

Hair and Sun safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

School uniform hats must be worn outside from 1st August to 1st May and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wraparound that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS

Uniform items can be purchased from PSW at their Deer Park Outlet.

Support for families experiencing difficulty

Please contact the Principal or the Business Manager to discuss support that we may be able to provide to families experiencing difficulty meeting uniform costs, including information about eligibility for uniform support through State Schools' Relief. IMPLEMENTATION

Deanside Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, the classroom teacher must make contact with the family to seek understanding around the reasons of the non-compliance.

If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Assistant Principal will be informed, and will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

Measures taken by Deanside Primary School to address concerns about student non-compliance with the Student Dress Code will also be addressed in accordance with our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.
- When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:
- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.
- The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an
 exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents
 or carers.

CONCERNS ABOUT THIS STUDENT DRESS CODE
